Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention

*Conference costs (legal background)*

Art.14



1. The costs of the Meetings of the States Parties, the Special Meetings of the States Parties, the Review Conferences and the Amendment Conferences shall be borne by the States Parties and States not parties to this Convention participating therein, in accordance with the United Nations scale of assessment adjusted appropriately.
2. The costs incurred by the Secretary-General of the United Nations under Articles 7 and 8 and the costs of any fact-finding mission shall be borne by the States Parties in accordance with the United Nations scale of assessment adjusted appropriately.



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*Financial deficit faced by the Convention*

- Outstanding unpaid assessed contributions for 2018:  
(2018 budget: USD 824,900.00) **USD 55,577.58**
- Outstanding assessments for 2019:  
(2019 budget: USD 824,900.00) **USD 386,261.52**  
(~47% collection rate)
